Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<p>The teaching-learning process of an educational institution without well-defined programme, programme specific and course outcomes is like a ship without a rudder. However, only chalking out different programme and course related outcomes is not enough. It is equally important for an educational institution to make sure that all the programmes and courses are completed in time. The teachers of Raniganj Girls' College have been very committed to benefitting their students with dedicated and sincere service. Several measures are taken to timely complete the courses opted by the students. However, things have undergone a drastic change with Covid 19 wreaking havocs worldwide. Yet, the last two years' period was not all about despair and desolation, it was also a time offering new opportunities to almost all sectors. If the domains with least facilities and resources could thwart the challenges posed by the Pandemic, how could the education sector with much greater resources, both material and human, remain unresponsive to it? The teachers of Raniganj Girls' College not only tried their best to make the online teaching most effective and rewarding for their students, but also ensured their timely completion. Following are some of the measures adopted for the said purpose:</p> <p>(a) Classes were held on regular basis using online platforms like Google meet, Zoom etc. Students who were not very comfortable using these apps initially were aptly guided by the teachers. Later on, classes were held in Google classrooms, which made the entire process all the more systematic and transparent.</p> <p>(b) Keeping in mind that students are far more comfortable with WhatsApp, the teachers also made good use of this app, at least during the initial stages of the Pandemic, to impart teaching to the students.</p> <p>(c) Despite all the advantages of technology, there would be none denying that technology does create digital divide. It is often reported that students belonging to the remotest areas, or at least places with poor internet connectivity, often miss online classes. Raniganj Girls' College may justifiably claim to stand out as a proud exception in this regard. As soon as cases like the ones just mentioned were reported, the teachers gladly resorted to an easier mode of teaching i.e. teaching via conference call.</p> <p>(d) Projects and assignments were given online and students were thoroughly encouraged to submit them in time.</p> <p>(e) Master time table was prepared by the members of the concerned committee. Then online departmental meetings were held by the HoDs to prepare departmental time tables for each and every semester accordingly and request the teachers of their departments to strictly adhere to the time table.</p> <p>(f) Though efforts were made by the teachers to strictly follow the time table, there were also instances of flexibility so far as the timing of the classes was concerned. A teacher who would be busy for the whole day attending to some urgent affair would gladly schedule a class in the evening. This would never have been possible with offline classes.</p> <p>(g) Special care was taken that not many days were spent to complete the internal assessments lest the number of teaching days should be curtailed.</p> <p>(h) Online materials were abundantly supplied to students so that their learning experience got better and more enriched.</p>
