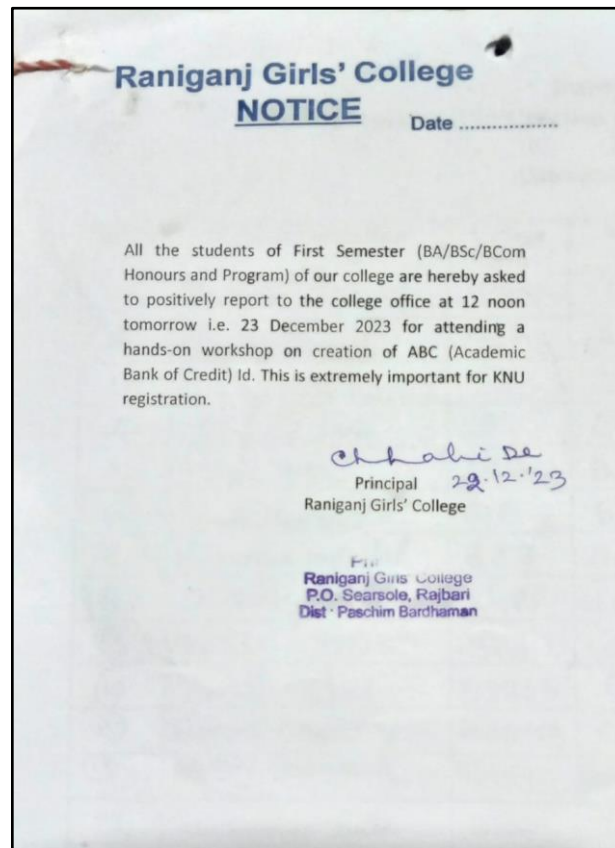

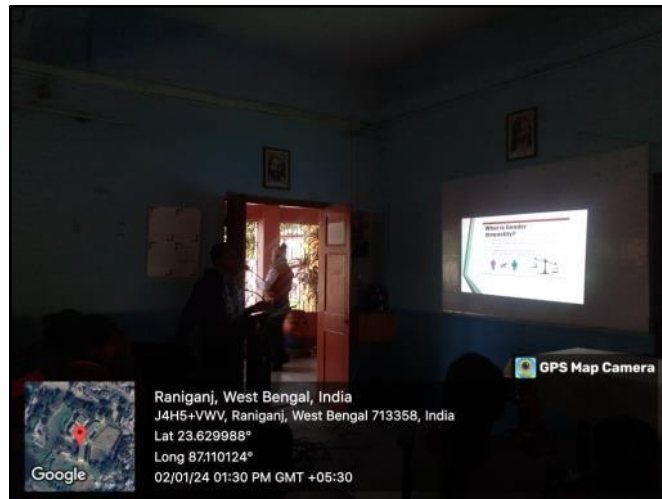


- 1. The participants learnt about the meaning of HIV and AIDS**

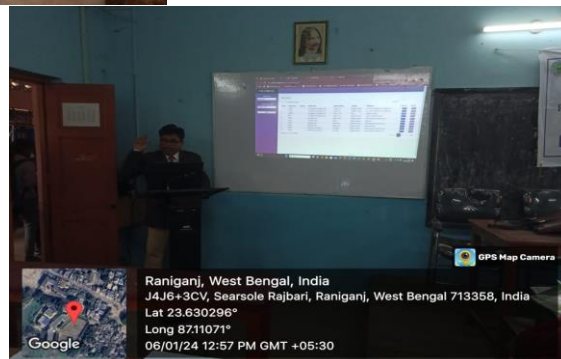
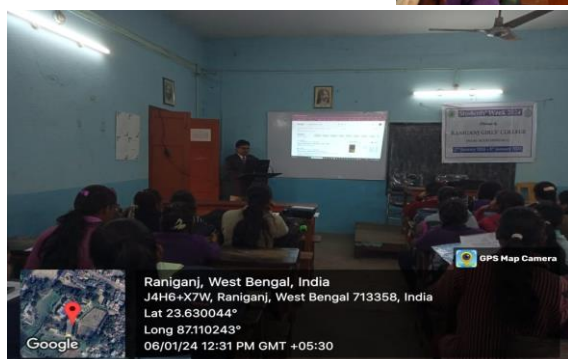

Invited Lecture on “Digital Education”

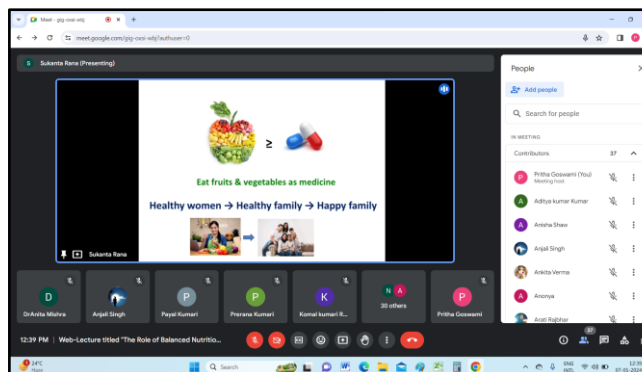
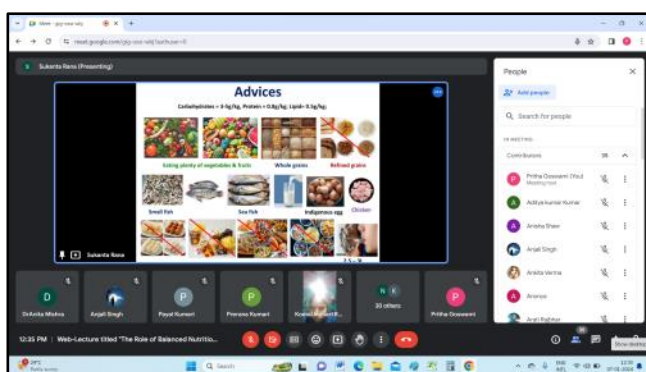
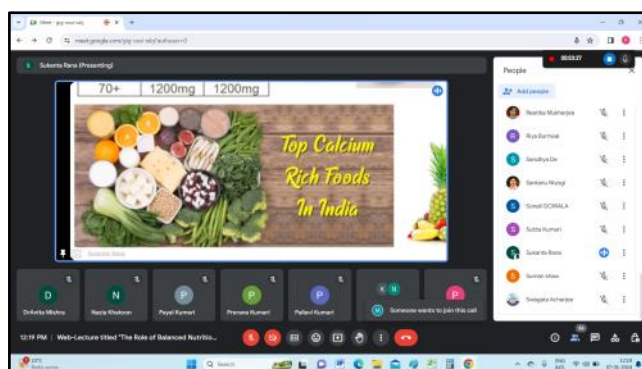
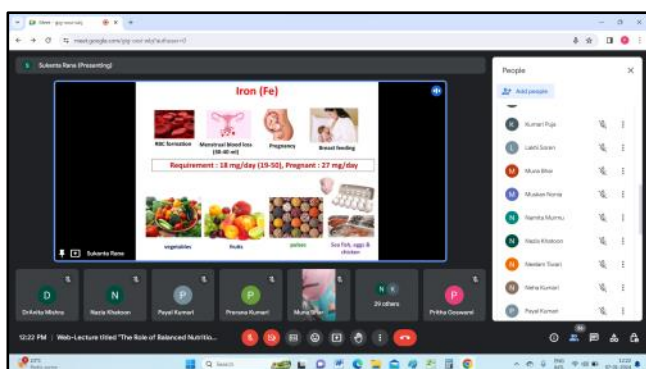
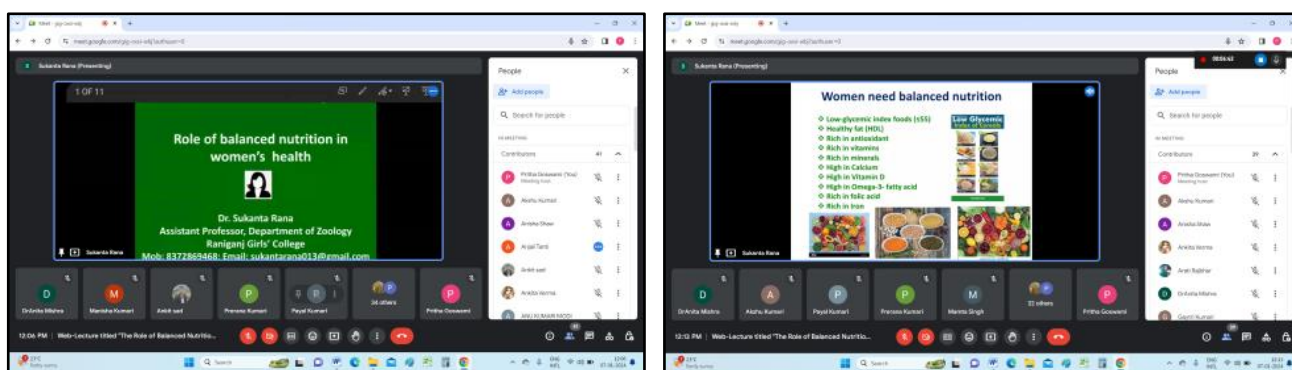

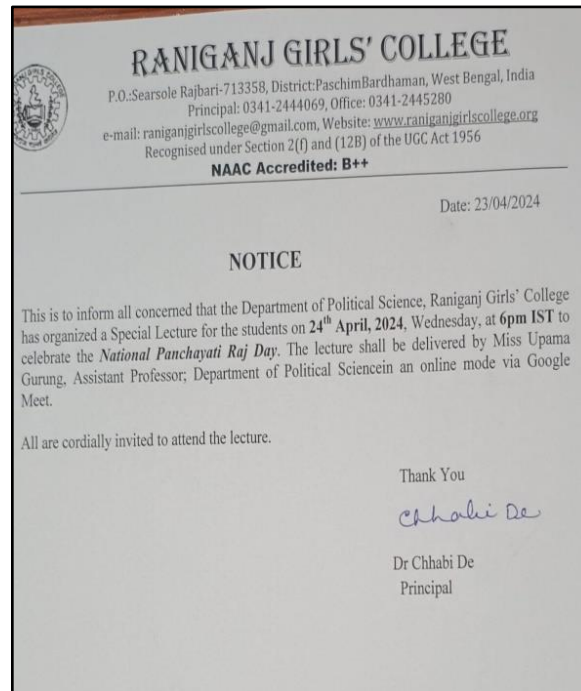

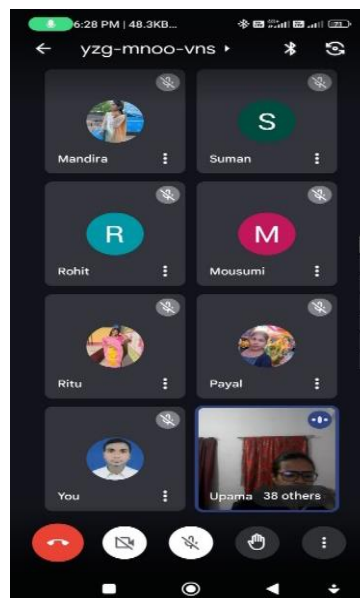
